Since 1969, ReSurge International (formerly Interplast) has provided free reconstructive surgeries for the poor. With Stanford University roots, it renews the health and dreams of thousands of children and adults each year—so they can go to school, provide for their families and be productive members of society. It empowers local doctors to increase year-round access to medical care in underserved areas and provides comprehensive reconstructive surgery and follow-up care. By doing so, ReSurge impacts the world by reducing suffering and poverty, giving patients and their families a second chance for a normal life.

Summary of Care 2011

For more than 42 years, ReSurge International has led the charge in reconstructive surgery around the world. With a comprehensive tiered approach, ReSurge ensures sustainable access to high-quality care for its patients year-round. In fiscal year 2011, our programs provided much-needed services (details below) to the poor and those who treat them.



Prevention

ReSurge launched its first burn prevention initiative in Latin America. In partnership with Physicians for Peace, ReSurge helped distribute more than 200 coloring books to educate children and their families on ways to prevent burn accidents in their homes.



Care

ReSurge performed more than 4,500 surgeries this fiscal year. Through these procedures our patients, 85% of whom are children, were given a second chance at life. To date, ReSurge has provided more than 90,000 surgeries worldwide.



Recovery

After surgery, our work continues. More than 600 speech therapy sessions and 384 orthodontic treatments for cleft patients were provided. For our burn patients, we provided physical therapy to help ensure they regain full mobility after their surgeries.



Scale

ReSurge held 29 visiting educator and surgical trips. More than 300 international medical staff benefited from the education. Medical professionals can use the skills they learned to benefit their communities. In addition, ReSurge is working to scale its burn programs in India and Nepal.

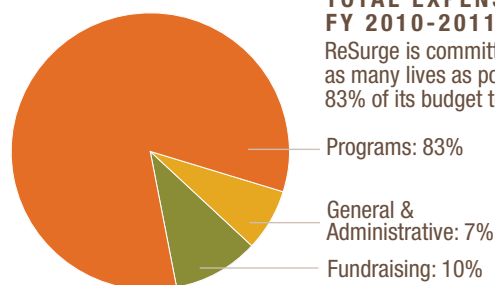

TOTAL EXPENSES

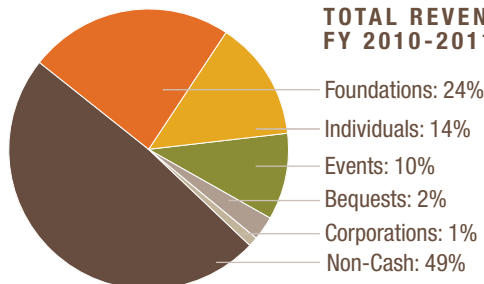

FY 2010-2011: \$7,722,076



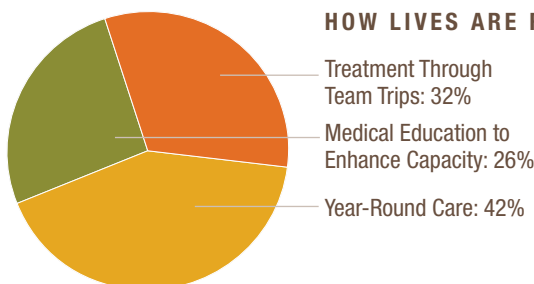
Financials

ReSurge relies on donated medical supplies, equipment and volunteers so that every \$1 contributed to ReSurge is leveraged into \$2 of medical care. ReSurge also partners with local medical personnel to provide year-round access to care, increasing the number of surgeries it performs while reducing operating costs.

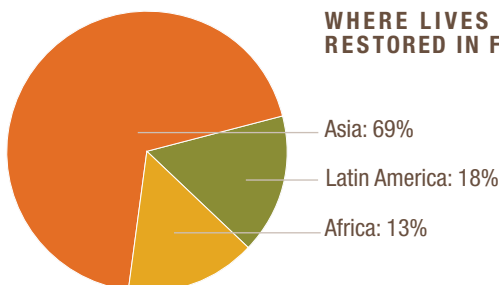
ReSurge operates in an environment of transparency, accountability and integrity to fulfill its mission and to uphold and earn donors' trust and support. Its board of directors—composed of 23 medical, legal and business leaders—understands its financial responsibilities to ensure the exclusive and effective use of all assets for charitable purposes.

Every year, ReSurge receives an independent audit in compliance with the California Nonprofit Integrity Act and files a Form 990 with the Internal Revenue Service. Moreover, ReSurge's financials and operations are rigorously reviewed each year for its continuing membership in InterAction, the largest alliance of U.S.-based NGOs. ReSurge also received the second highest rating with Charity Navigator.
